WHEREAS, the presence of crime in our communities spreads fear and destroys trust and faith in others, threatening our lives, liberty and general welfare; and

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of all of us, from all ages and walks of life, to work together with law enforcement to keep ourselves, our families and our communities safe from crime, in order to make life enjoyable for all; and

WHEREAS, effective crime prevention programs excel because of partnerships among law enforcement, civic groups, schools, faith communities, businesses and individuals who work together toward the common goal of increasing public safety; and

WHEREAS, Neighborhood Watch has brought countless communities together, inspiring members, bridging divides and strengthening bonds through willingness of neighbors to help each other build a better community; and

WHEREAS, the Neighborhood Watch program makes it possible for neighbors to help their neighbors and to strengthen the partnership between law enforcement and the community; and

WHEREAS, Neighborhood Watch encourages individuals groups to work directly with local law enforcement agencies to report suspicious activities and be the "eyes and ears," never intervening in a law enforcement duty; and

WHEREAS, Neighborhood Watch, along with Crime Watch, Business Watch and other programs, is a time-honored tradition with over 25,000 programs, 7,000 law enforcement agencies and 2.5 million participants throughout the United States:
